### TODAY'S COMMEMORATION

The 32<sup>nd</sup> World Day of the Sick is celebrated traditionally on the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. The theme of Pope Francis' message for the 2024 commemoration: "It is not good that man should be alone—Healing the Sick by Healing Relationships" and the text of his Message is available on the noticeboard and Bishopric website.

### TEACHING POINT

The weekdays of Lent from Ash Wednesday to the Saturday before Palm Sunday take precedence over the memorials of the Saints, which therefore may be celebrated only in the particular form laid down by the liturgical books. Memorials of saints occurring on weekdays may be celebrated by substituting the collect of the saint in the Mass of the Day. Only when some genuine need or pastoral advantage requires it may an appropriate Mass for various needs and occasions be celebrated. Votive Masses and daily Masses for the Dead are prohibited. Throughout the Lent Season the Alleluia is always omitted. The Gloria is said or sung on solemnities, feasts and special occasions only, being omitted from Sunday Masses. It is not permitted to adorn the altar with flowers, and the organ may only be played for the purpose of sustaining singing. An exception is made for *Laetare* Sunday and for solemnities and feasts.
