TODAY'S COMMEMORATION

The Baptism of the Lord marks liturgically the conclusion of the Christmas Season and the beginning of Ordinary Time. It's a feast of transition from Jesus' hidden life to that of his public ministry. It also echoes the theme of the Epiphany in that it is another manifestation announcing Jesus' divinity to all of his first followers and to the disciples of John the Baptist. The manifestation of the sonship and divinity of Jesus took place in a physical, audible and visible form so that all present would know, without question, that Jesus was the Son of the Father.
