PAPAL PROCLAMATION

Pope Francis gave his traditional Urbi et Orbi message and blessing to the city and to the world on Christmas Day to pilgrims gathered in St Peter's Square. The Holy Father reflected that the birth of the Lord Jesus is, "the mystery that never ceases to amaze and move us." He underscored how "the door of God's heart is always open" and may we "be reconciled with God" and with one another for a world marked by peace and harmony. CATHEDRAL DECORATION

Many favourable comments have been received about how our church looked and felt during the Christmas celebrations, and we are grateful to all who arranged the displays, made music and served at the liturgies, together with those who welcomed visitors

TEACHING POINT

The Christmas feast proper ends on the final day of its octave, the solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, on 1st January. The 'peak' of the Christmas 'season' is the Feast of the Epiphany, 6th January (transferred to the preceding Sunday) the end of the 12 Days of Christmas. Tree and other decorations are traditionally kept us up at least until this day is over. The official end of the Christmas season in the current liturgical calendar is the Baptism of the Lord (this year falling on Sunday, 12th January), after which Ordinary Time begins. The nativity scene may be displayed through this day or until the Presentation of the Lord on 2nd February, a feast of Jesus and the end of the ancient Forty Days of the Christmas season.
