#### LITURGICAL SYMBOLISM

The lights of the candles on the Advent Wreath break through the darkness, reminding us of the Light of Christ that we anticipate during this holy season, with all of the elements carrying powerful symbolism. The evergreens used for the wreath itself are a reminder of continuous life, and the shaping of them into a circle reinforces the meaning of it being a sign of life eternal in Christ. The four candles used mark the Sundays of Advent before Christmas. The purple candles are reminders that this should be a time of prayer and sacrifice to prepare us for the second coming of Christ. On the third Sunday, the pink candle is lit to announce a day of rejoicing for Christ is coming near. A fifth white candle in the centre of the Wreath represents Christ himself, and is lit as a remembrance of the manifestation of the Light of the World.

# TEACHING POINT

The Jesse Tree tradition is rooted in Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." Jesse was the father of David, Israel's greatest king, and Jesus is descended from the line of David. He is the branch God promised would grow from Jesse's family tree. Each symbol, which our children will tell us about at the offertory, represents a story from this family tree and a step toward the birth of Jesus
